125330 **Action Milk Car**

Several persons were hospitalized this morning in the wake of a failed milk delivery by a deranged railway employee.

At approximately 9:30 a.m. EDT, a refrigerated milk car was spotted in SHS Yard by a train of the D&K Railroad. Eyewitnesses stated that an attendant, who had been hiding inside the car, opened the door and began throwing milk at passers-by on Railroad Avenue. The milk was packaged in ten-gallon galvanized steel cans that weighed over 90 scale pounds each. Hurling at velocities in excess of 110 scale miles per hour, the cans knocked over pedestrians and produced large dents in several die-cast vehicles. One eyewitness recalled seeing an eerie yellow glow coming from inside the freight car.

The milk car was registered to the A. C. Gilbert Company of New Haven CT. Gilbert operated a dairy until the late 1950s but is not currently licensed by the USDA. Nearly all of Gilbert's milk was packaged in half-pint bottles for consumption by factory employees; long-distance deliveries outside of southern New England were very rare. Fil Oparo >>
